## II. PREFACE



The population and household projections as well as local area needs analysis are crucial research projects that inform future Aboriginal housing planning in Victoria. The results of the population and household projections will assist Aboriginal Housing Victoria to undertake future planning processes using evidence based hard data on future Aboriginal population and household trends. This project will inform housing needs analysis and Aboriginal housing planning at regional levels and Local Government Area (LGA) levels.

The needs analysis will be a key input for modelling for resource allocation among various regions and will help to inform the capital works program. The data from the study will be useful for Aboriginal Housing Victoria agency reports to the Victoria Government and to any future Aboriginal Housing related negotiations with the Federal Government.

Population and household projections contained in this report are disaggregated by various regions and Local government areas which are being used for service planning and service delivery by many agencies, including Aboriginal Housing Victoria Districts (3) the Department of Health & Human Services Regions (17 DHHS Areas); Remoteness Areas (1. Major Cities, 2. Regional & Remote Areas); Indigenous Regions (1. Melbourne, 2. Victoria Excluding Melbourne); and

the Local Government Areas (LGAs) numbering 79 based on the 2016 geography. Therefore, the outcomes of these projections are not only useful to the AHV but to many other agencies and the Victorian Government and Aboriginal Community Organisations as well.

AHV commissioned Dr. Noor Ahmad Khalidi to undertake these projections. Dr Khalidi is a demographer and has over 26 years of work experience in Indigenous affairs in Australia including as a Senior Advisor to the Office of Indigenous Policy, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. Previously, he has completed similar projects, among others, for the NSW Aboriginal Housing Office, NSW Aboriginal Land Council, NSW Department of Aboriginal Affairs and Qld Department of Community Services.

I am sure many agencies and community organisations will find this report useful.

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### III. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



The aim of the project is to forecast (project into the future years) Aboriginal Population and Household Numbers and Persons Living in Aboriginal Households from 2016 to 2036. If a household has at least one Indigenous person who is a usual resident and who was present on Census Night that household will be classified as a Household with Indigenous persons. Based on the above definition, the total number of persons living in Indigenous households is usually more than the total counted or projected Indigenous population for a given area. This is because the household may include non-Indigenous persons as well.

Projections are based on the results of the last three consecutive censuses of 2006, 2011 and 2016. Projections contained in this report are disaggregated by various regions and Local government areas which are being used for service planning and service delivery by many agencies, including Aboriginal Housing Victoria Districts (3) the Department of Health & Human Services Regions (17 DHHS Areas); Remoteness Areas (1. Major Cities, 2. Regional & Remote Areas); Indigenous Regions (1. Melbourne, 2. Victoria Excluding Melbourne); and the Local Government Areas (LGAs) numbering 79 based on the 2016 geography.

Population projections are carried out using the standard demographic cohort-component method of population projections to year 2036 based on the 2016 Estimated Resident Population (ERPs) and assumptions of trends in fertility, mortality and migration. Household projections in this report are based on household (dwellings) counts from the last three consecutive censuses of 2006, 2011 and 2016 and the observed trends in the relativities of the last three censuses, ERP for 30 June 2016, and the outcomes of population projections as per this project for 30 June 2016 to 2036. For these projections a propensity method is adapted.

The method identifies relativities from the Census of Population and Housing for persons living in various household types. In these projections, households living arrangement types utilizing a six-variable nested table for Victoria and each Region and Local Government Area.

These projections show that during the 20 years from 2016 the total Indigenous population of Victoria will increase from 57,782 on 30 June 2016 to 95,149 persons on 30 June 2036. This growth indicates that 37,396 more Indigenous people will be residing in Victoria in 2036 indicating an average annual growth rate of 2.5%. Meanwhile, during this period Indigenous households will increase from 22,756 to 50,328 in year 2036 indicating 27,572 more households and consequently, need for almost 28,000 more dwellings, in Victoria to house the increased indigenous households.

The Indigenous population growth rates will slow down from 2.7% at the beginning of the projections period to 2.5% at the end of the projections period.

The female Indigenous population of Victoria continues to grow faster than males. Measured by sex ratios, in 2016 there were 99.6 Indigenous men for each 100 Indigenous women in Victoria. At the end of the projection period in 2036 there will be 97.2 Indigenous men for each 100 Indigenous woman in Victoria.

On average the Indigenous population of Victoria will be 2.3 years older in 2036 compared to 2016. Median age will increase from 22.8 years to 25.1 years. The ageing of the Indigenous male population is faster than that of the Indigenous females. While there was a slightly younger Indigenous male population (median age 22.4 years) in Victoria in 2016, in 2036

Indigenous females will have a younger age composition with a median age of 24.8 compared to 22.4 for the Indigenous males.

### III. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



Differential mortality, fertility and migration impact on the age-sex composition of the Indigenous population of Victoria during the 20 years from 2016 as evidenced through visible changes in age-sex population pyramids.

These projections show that with an Indigenous population of 22,325 persons, the Aboriginal Housing Victoria Eastern Region was the most populous region in 2016 and with a projected Indigenous population of 36,873, will remain so in 2036 as well. However, the Northern Region emerges as the fastest growing region growing at a rate of 2.64% per year.

In 2016, 49% of the Victorian Indigenous people were living in Melbourne IREG Region and 51% Elsewhere in Victoria except Melbourne. During the next 20 years from 2016 to 2036 Melbourne Indigenous Region will grow at 2.3% per year on average. At the same period the Indigenous population of Elsewhere in Victoria except Melbourne will experience a higher average annual growth rate of 2.7%. However, these differential growth rates will see very little change in spatial distribution of the Indigenous population in Victoria. In 2036, the proportions of those living in Melbourne Region will be 47% and Elsewhere in Victoria 53%.

During the 20 years from 2016 to 2036 very little changes will occur in many demographic indicators of the Indigenous population living in Melbourne IREG. However, some noticeable changes in demographic indicators of the Indigenous population living Elsewhere in Victoria other than Melbourne will occur. Sex Ratio, that is the number of women for each 100 men, will decrease from 99.3 to 95.5, the median age of the population will increase from 21.2 to 24.3, the proportion of the age-dependent population will decrease from 42.3% to 38%, hence forcing the dependency ratio down from 73.2 to 61.3.

According to the ABS, Remoteness Australia has the following areas: Major Cities, Inner Regional, Outer Regional, Remote and Very Remote. Very Remote Areas do not exist in Victoria. Due to small numbers in these projections Inner Regional, Outer Regional and Remote Areas were combined under the heading "Regional & Remote Areas". All projections were carried out by Major Cities and Regional & Remote Areas in Victoria.

In 2016 about 52% of the Indigenous population of Victoria lived in Major Cities and 48% in Regional and Remote Areas. In 20 years from 2016 these proportions will see marginal changes where the proportion of those living in Major Cities decrease to 51% and the proportion of those living in Regional and Remote areas will increase to 49%.

On average the Indigenous population of major cities will grow at 2.4% per year from 2016 to 2036 against a higher average annual growth rate of 2.6% for the Regional and Remote.

In 2016 there were almost equal number of Indigenous males and females living in Major Cities as in Regional and Remote Victoria. However, in the 20 years from 2016 sex ratios for both remoteness areas will drop, in Major Cities to 97.6 Indigenous men to 100 Indigenous women and to 97 men to 100 Indigenous women in Regional and Remote Areas.

Median age in Major Cities will increase 2.4 years to 26.8 years against 4 years increase to 24.5 years in Regional and Remote Areas. Hence the Indigenous population will remain relatively young.

At the beginning of the projection years in 2016 the gap between Major Cities and Regional and Remote areas in term of age-dependency ratios was quite noticeable, 54.8 against 75.9 for each 100 persons aged 15-64 years old (21 years). However, in 20 years this gap will be reduced to only 2.8 persons.

### III. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



DHHS Bayside Peninsula with 5,099 Indigenous persons was the most populous DHHS Area in 2016 and with a projected 8,137 Indigenous persons, will remain so after 20 years. In contrast DHHS Inner Eastern Melbourne with 1,578 Indigenous persons was the least populous Area and after 20 years will remain so with 2,875 Indigenous residents.

With an average annual growth rate of 3.3% DHHS Central Highlands will grow fastest while DHHS Hume Moreland will experience the least growth with an average annual growth rate of only 0.4% per year.

In 2016 among the 17 DHHS Areas, Western Melbourne with the highest sex ratio (112 males to each 100 females), the least percentage of dependent population, has the lowest dependency ratio and the highest median age. In contrast DHHS Ovens Murray has the lowest sex ratio (90.3 males to each 100 females) with mid-range dependency ratios had the youngest median age of 19.9 years.

In 2036 DHHS Goulburn is projected to have the highest sex ratio (122.6 males to each 100 females), low percentage of dependent population and dependency ratio and the highest median age. In contrast DHHS Central Highlands has the lowest sex ratio (76.8 males to each 100 females) with mid-range dependency ratios and the youngest median age of 22.6 years.

In 2016 there were 22,756 Indigenous households in Victoria. Indigenous households in Victoria are projected to grow during the 2016-2036 projection years with an average rate of 4% per year and will reach 50,328 households in year 2036. Meantime, the number of persons, including non-Indigenous persons, living in Indigenous households will grow slightly slower at the rate of 3.8% per year. Family and household fragmentation are the main cause of faster growth of households. As a result, household size will see very marginal change.

Projections indicate that changes in household composition would be marginal.

# IV. PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS



This work is in response to the following specifications agreed with the Aboriginal Housing Victoria:

## A. PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the project include:

- Provide census data that will complement other data sources.
- Enable Aboriginal housing needs analysis at local area levels
- Assist in business planning, housing program planning and in modelling housing policies to meet agency and bilateral agreement commitments.
- Provide vital emerging need information that together with the Supply and Demand Project to assist in decision making for allocation of resources to meet Aboriginal housing needs.
- Assist in projecting new housing, maintenance and housing type (bedroom category) needs.
- Inform Aboriginal Housing Victoria on spatial patterns of growing Aboriginal population and the changing dynamics of family and household structures, migration patterns and the implication for planning for housing delivery.
- Provide readily useful information to Aboriginal Housing Victoria, including Regional Offices that will inform Aboriginal Housing Victoria input or advice to government and non-governmental agencies, including partners in the provision of Aboriginal housing related services.

## B. PROJECT SCOPE

### B.1 Projection Years

The aim of the project is to forecast (project into the future years) Aboriginal Population and Household Numbers and Persons Living in Aboriginal Households from 2016 to 2036.

Projections will be based on the results of the 2016 Population Census as well as previous census results as required.

Forecasting years: 2021, 2026, 2031, 2036.

### B.2 Definitions

#### B.2.1 Indigenous Household definition

In the 2016 Census an Indigenous household is defined as:

“If a household has at least one Indigenous person who is a usual resident and who was present on Census Night it will be classified as a Household with Indigenous persons.”  
(ABS, 2901.0, *Census Dictionary*).

This definition is applied to all “occupied private dwellings”:

1. Household with Indigenous person(s)
2. Other Households
3. Not applicable.

Based on the above definition, the total number of persons living in Indigenous households is usually more than the total counted or projected Indigenous population for a given area. This is because the household may include non-Indigenous persons as well.

## G. PROJECTIONS METHODOLOGY

### G.1 Population Projections Methodology

Population projections will be based on the standard demographic cohort-component method of population projections. Projections to year 2036 are based on the following data:

- Base Indigenous Estimated Resident Population (ERP) by males and females at mid-point of the initial year (30 June 2016) in five-years age groups;
- Base fertility levels and assumed future changes in fertility;
- Base mortality levels and assumed future changes in mortality; and
- Base estimates of migration and assumed future changes.

### G.2 Households Projection Methodology

A census of population and housing is held every five years. It gives a count of households, families and individuals at the census reference date. Household projections will be based on household (dwellings) counts from the last three consecutive censuses of 2006, 2011 and 2016 and the observed trends in the relativities of the last three censuses, ERP for 30 June 2016, and the outcomes of population projections as per this project for 30 June 2016 to 2036.

For these projections a propensity method will be adapted. The method identifies relativities from the Census of Population and Housing for persons living in various household types. In these projections, households living arrangement types utilizing a six-variable nested table for Victoria and each Region.

For example, total Victoria households living arrangement relativities will be derived by tabulating (1) Number of Households (2) by

Number of Aboriginal persons in Household > (3) by Households Family Type > (4) by Households Tenure & Landlord Type by > (5) Equivalised Household Weekly Income by > (6) Housing Cost as % of Weekly Income by > (6) Number of Aboriginal Persons in household.

The trends observed in these relativities over the last three censuses will be assumed to continue up to 2036.

It should be noted that, when the ABS supplied Indigenous Households data for this project for base years 2006-2016 at the state and sub-state levels as a nested matrix by [>Age> Number of ATSI in HH>Household Family Types>Tenure>Income], they applied a procedure called Perturbation, to remove very small numbers due to privacy issues. As a result, the sum of the sub-groups do not always add to the correct State Total. For example, the sum of small area variables level data supplied to us for 2016 equalled 22,756 while the correct sum of the State was 23,691 a difference of 935 households.

### G.3 Population Projection Methodology at Local Government Areas (LGAs) Level

In the case of producing Aboriginal population projections at the Local Government area levels (LGAs), due to small number of base populations by age-sex in many LGAs, the following methodology will be applied:

1. LGAs will be grouped by 17 DHHS Regions; and
2. The projected Aboriginal populations of each DHHS Region by age-sex will be pro-rata applied to the LGA populations of the region by age-sex.

# V. POPULATION PROJECTIONS



## 1. BASE DATA

### 1.1 Base Population

#### 1.1.1 Population based on Places of Usual Residence

The 2016 census outcomes were used in these projections. The most recent Census of Population and Housing was conducted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) on 9 August 2016. Population data based on the Census Place of Usual Residence (PUR) are publicly available for all Census and non-Census (LGAs) geographic areas using the Online Census Table Builder application by the ABS.

Place of Usual Residence (PUR) data refer to persons' places of usual residence on Census night which was 9 August 2016. Indigenous PUR population data from 2016 Census are publicly available by Age and Sex at the LGA level for Victoria using the Online Census Table Builder application. As the Aboriginal Housing Victoria (AHV) as well as the DHHS Areas in Victoria are based on the LGA boundaries, by aggregation of the related LGA PUR population data from 2016 Census, base population data for these regions were initially constructed. Similarly, PUR population data are available from the ABS for Indigenous Regions (IREGs) and Remoteness Areas. (Appendix 4.2)

### *1.1. Estimated Resident Population (ERP)*

As per the Project Specifications, Indigenous Estimated Resident Population (ERP) by males and females at mid-point of the initial year (30 June 2016) in five-years age groups are required to undertake population projections. According to ABS, estimates of the resident population are based on Census counts by place of usual residence, to which are added the estimated Census net undercount and the number of Australian residents estimated to have been temporarily overseas on Census night. Overseas visitors in Australia on Census night are excluded

in this calculation. Post-Census ERP is obtained by adding to the estimated population at the beginning of each period the component of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and the component of net overseas migration.

For the states and territories, estimated interstate movements involving a change of usual residence were also taken into account. ABS released the Estimated Resident Population (ERP) for the Indigenous population by 5-year Age Groups and Sex at the state and Territory level on 21 June 2018 (Australian Demographic Statistics, Dec 2017).

Indigenous ERPs are not yet produced by the ABS at lower geographic level than States and Territories. Hence LGA (Appendix 4.3) and Regional Indigenous ERPs for Victoria are prorate estimated using the Census reported PUR population data and the State level ERPs by age and sex.

## 1.2 Births and Fertility

In 2016 there were 1508 Indigenous births registered where 923 were by Indigenous women

and 585 where only the father was an Indigenous person. Births, birth rates and Indigenous births to non-Indigenous mothers are provided in tables 1.3, 1.4 & 1.5 below.

### 1.3 Mortality

ABS published Indigenous mortality by Remoteness in its most recent publication Deaths, Australia, 2016, Released Wed 27 Sept 2017. It should be noted that mortality data by remoteness are provided by the ABS at Australia level, not by remoteness areas for each State and Territory. The reasons are two folds, first at State and Territory levels the number of births and death events are small, hence the rates would be less reliable. Secondly, the purpose of the Remoteness Structure is to provide a classification for the release of statistics that inform policy development by classifying

Australia into large regions that share common characteristics of remoteness. With this definition a very remote area in the Northern Territory and in NSW share common characteristics of remoteness and therefore the impact of those should be the same on the affected populations.

ABS published *Life Tables for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians, 2010-2012* (cat. no. 3302.0.55.003) on 15 November 2013. According to this publication Life expectancy at birth for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders in 2010-2012 was 69.1 years for men and 73.7 years for women.

A key component of the Indigenous population projection process is the use of mortality levels, usually measured by the expectations of life at birth, and age-sex pattern of mortality, usually taken from Indigenous life tables proportion dying at an exact age (qx) values.

Data presented in the above tables will be used as mortality levels for the base year 2016 together with expected future trends. The estimated mortality differentials by remoteness and the expected trends are incorporated in these projections in order to improve population projection outcomes.

## 1.4 Migration

The size, age and sex distribution of the Indigenous population of Victoria, regions and LGAs are affected by population influx due to inter-LGA migration within the region, Intra-State migration within Victoria and Inter-State migration to and from Victoria. The effects of international migration and births to non-Indigenous women by Indigenous fathers are negligible on the Victorian Indigenous population.

The 2006 and 2011 Census' returns did not register any significant evidence of population influx due to change of identification. This phenomenon is yet to be examined for the 2016 census outcomes. As such, change of identification is not considered a factor in these projections.

Internal migration data at the LGA levels were derived from the census question on places of usual residence 5 years prior to census compared with data on places of usual residence on Census night. Using Table Builder online services from ABS, counts of people by LGAs of usual residence on the 2016 Census night against the LGAs of usual residence 5 years before the Census were extracted which provide data on those who migrated from other LGAs and those who migrated to other LGAs during the 5 year period before the census.

For the remoteness areas, the data were derived from aggregation of LGAs by Remoteness. LGAs were assigned to remoteness areas based on the remoteness classification of the place of usual residence of majority of their population.

Table 1.8 shows summary outcomes of migration in Victoria. On average each year 131 Indigenous males and 112 Indigenous females are being added to the resident population of the state by means of positive inter-state net migration.

## 2. POPULATION PROJECTION OUTCOMES

### 2.1 Population Size and Growth

These projections show that during the 20 years from 2016 the total Indigenous population of Victoria will increase from 57,782 persons on 30 June 2016 to 95,149 persons on 30 June 2036, indicating 37,396 more Indigenous people will be residing in the State in 2036 indicating an average annual growth rate of 2.5%. The growth rates slow down from 2.7% at the beginning of the period to 2.5% at the end of the projections period (Table 2.1).

## 2.2 Changes in Demographic Indicators

### 2.2.1 Sex Structure

The female Indigenous population of Victoria continues to grow faster than males. Measured by sex ratios, Table 2.5 shows that in 2016 there were 99.6 Indigenous men for each 100 Indigenous women in Victoria. At the end of the projection period in 2036 there will be 97.2 Indigenous men for each 100 Indigenous women in Victoria.

### 2.2.2 Age Structure


On average the Indigenous population of Victoria will be 2.3 years older in 2036 compared to 2016. Median age will increase from 22.8 years to 25.1 years. The ageing of the Indigenous male population is faster than that of Indigenous females. While there was a slightly younger Indigenous male population (median age 22.4 years) in Victoria in 2016, in 2036 Indigenous females will have a younger age composition with a median age of 24.8 compared to 22.4 for the Indigenous males.




**Chart 1: Indigenous Population Age-Sex Pyramid, Victoria, 2016**

These population pyramids show that slowing down of the fertility, visible at the bases of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> pyramids, combine with more young people moving up to middle ages and improved survival of old people, to shift the sharp pyramid shape of 2016 towards a more mature barrel shape in 2036.

These demographic changes reduce the size of the dependent population aged 0-14 and 65 and more from 39.1% in 2016 to 37.2% in 2036 reflected in an improving dependency ratio from 64.2 in 2016 to 59.1 in 2036 (Table 2.7).

## 2.3 Population Projections at the Regional Levels

### 2.3.1 Aboriginal Housing Victoria regions (AHV)

These projections show that with an Indigenous population of 22,325 persons, the Aboriginal Housing Victoria Eastern Region was the most populous region in 2016 and with a projected Indigenous population of 36,873, will remain so in 2036 as well. However, the Northern Region emerges as the fastest growing region growing at a rate of 2.64% per year.

### 2.3.2 Indigenous Regions (IREG)

In 2016, 49% of the Victorian Indigenous people were living in Melbourne IREG Region and 51% Elsewhere in Victoria except Melbourne (Table 2.16). During the next 20 years from 2016 to 2036 Melbourne Indigenous Region will grow at 2.3% per year on average. At the same period the Indigenous population of Elsewhere in Victoria except Melbourne will experience a higher average annual growth rate of 2.7%. However, these differential growth rates will see very little change in spatial distribution of the Indigenous population in Victoria. In 2036, the proportions of those living in Melbourne Region will be 47% and Elsewhere in Victoria 53% (Table 2.16).

During the next 20 years from 2016 to 2036 very little changes will occur in many demographic indicators of the Indigenous population living in Melbourne IREG Region (Table 2.17). However, some noticeable changes in demographic indicators of the Indigenous population living Elsewhere in Victoria other than Melbourne will occur. Sex Ratio, that is number of women for each 100 men, will decrease from 99.3 to 95.5, the median age of the population will increase from 21.2 to 24.3, the proportion of the age-dependent population will decrease from 42.3% to 38%, hence forcing the dependency ratio down from 73.2 to 61.3.

### 2.3.3 Remoteness Areas

According to the ABS, Australia has the following areas: Major Cities, Inner Regional, Outer Regional, Remote and Very Remote. Very Remote Areas do not exist in Victoria. Due to small numbers in these projections Inner Regional, Outer Regional and Remote Areas were combined under the heading "Regional & Remote Areas". All projections were carried out by Major Cities and Regional & Remote Areas in Victoria.

In 2016 about 52% of the Indigenous population of Victoria lived in Major Cities and 48% in Regional and Remote Areas. In 20 years from 2016 these proportions will see marginal changes where the proportion of those living in Major Cities decrease to 51% and the proportion of those living in Regional and Remote areas will increase to 49%.

On average the Indigenous population of major cities will grow at 2.4% per year from 2016 to 2036 against a higher average annual growth rate of 2.6% for the Regional and Remote (Table 2.19).

In 2016 there were almost equal numbers of Indigenous males and females living in Major Cities as in Regional and Remote Victoria. However, in 20 years from 2016 sex ratios for both remoteness areas will drop, in Major Cities to 97.6 Indigenous men to 100 Indigenous women and to 97 men to 100 Indigenous women in Regional and Remote Areas (Table 2.20).

Median age in Major Cities will increase 2.4 years to 26.8 years against a 4 years increase to 24.5 years in Regional and Remote Areas. Hence the Indigenous population will remain relatively young.

At the beginning of the projection years in 2016 the gap between Major Cities and Regional and Remote areas in terms of age-dependency ratios was quite noticeable, 54.8 against 75.9 for each 100 persons aged 15-64 years old (21 years). However, in 20 years this gap will be reduced to only 2.8 persons (Table 2.20).

## 2.3.4 Department of Housing and Human Services Areas (DHHS)

### 2.3.4.1 Population Size & Growth

DHHS Bayside Peninsula with 5,099 Indigenous persons was the most populous DHHS Area in 2016 with projected 8,137 Indigenous persons, and will remain so after 20 years. In contrast DHHS Inner Eastern Melbourne with 1,578 Indigenous persons was the least populous Area in 2016 and after 20 years will remain so with 2,875 Indigenous residents.

With an average annual growth rate of 3.3% DHHS Central Highlands will grow faster compared to DHHS Hume Moreland as the slowest growth area with an average annual growth rate of only 0.4% per year (Table 2.22 & Table 2.23).

#### 2.3.4.2 Demographic Indicators

In 2016 among the 17 DHHS Areas, **Western Melbourne** with the highest sex ratio (112 males to each 100 females), the least percentage of dependent population, has the lowest dependency ratio and the highest median age. In contrast **DHHS Ovens Murray** has the lowest sex ratio (90.3 males to each 100 females) with mid-range dependency ratios had the youngest median age of 19.9 years.

In 2036 **DHHS Goulburn** with the highest sex ratio (122.6 males to each 100 females), low percentage of dependent population and dependency ratio and the highest median age. In contrast **DHHS Central Highlands** has the lowest sex ratio (76.8 males to each 100 females) with mid-range dependency ratios had the youngest median age of 22.6 years.

### 3. HOUSEHOLDS PROJECTIONS

#### 3.1 Methodology

Households projections in this project are based on the number of households (dwellings) and population living arrangements from the last three consecutive censuses 2006, 2011 and 2016. Censuses of population and housing give accounts of households, families and individuals and living arrangements at the census reference date. The observed trends in the living arrangements relativities over the last three censuses, ERPs for 30 June 2016, and the outcomes of population projections as per this project for 30 June 2016 to 2036 form the basis for household's projections in this report.

For these projections a propensity method is adapted. The method identifies relativities from the Census of Population and Housing for persons living in various household types. In these projections, households living arrangement types utilize seven-variable nested tables for Victoria and each Region.

The trends observed in these relativities over the last three censuses will be assumed to continue up to 2036.

##### 3.1.1 Household Projections Base Data

Household projections base data consist of special data tabulations purchased from the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) from the last three consecutive censuses of 2006, 2011 and 2016. These special tabulations include number of Indigenous Households (any household where an Indigenous person is residing) by living arrangement types utilizing **seven-variable nested tables** for Victoria and each Region and each LGA.

For total Victoria (1), AHV Districts (3), DHHS Areas (17), Indigenous Regions IREG (2), and Remoteness Areas in Victoria (2) households living arrangement relativities are derived by tabulating: Number of Indigenous Households and Number of Persons in Indigenous households:

- (2) Age of Household Reference Person, >by
- (3) Number of Aboriginal persons in Household by >
- (4) Households Family Type by >
- (5) Households Tenure & Landlord Type > by

The above nested table consists of 725,726 Records against the above 7 variables separately for 2006, 2011 and 2016.

A similar seven variable nested table at the LGA level (79) was too large for Ms Excel, hence forced to remove the variable "Age of Household Reference Person" in order to make the file manageable by Ms Excel. The LGA base data file consists of 307,190 Records by 6 variables for 2006, 2011 and 2016.

Tabulated summary base data for census years 2006, 2011 and 2016 are provided at Appendix 4.4 to Appendix 4.12 for Victoria and all Regions and LGAs.

##### 3.1.2 Households Projections Step by Step Process

**Step 1:** Creating a single flat Excel file from the three Nested Variables Data files provided by the ABS at the LGA level for years 2006, 2011 & 2016 (**Dataset A**).

**Step 2:** Prorata adjustment of **Dataset A** by Household and Persons in Household Totals provided separately by the ABS.

**Step 3:** Adjusting Households data where "0" while there was a value for Persons in the same year (If AND (HHx<0, PRSx>0, HHx=1), where "x" is a living arrangement in a particular year.

**Step 4:** Obtaining State Level Benchmarks by generating Households and Persons Projections at the State level without any Nested Variables.

**Step 5:** Obtaining Households to Population Ratios

**Step 6:** Obtaining TREND projections of Households to Population Ratios

**Step 7:** Removing Negative Values of Households to Population Ratios

**Step 8:** Calculating the propensity of persons live in each living arrangement using the total count of persons as the denominator.

**Step 9:** Using Least Square Method a "Trend" is calculated for each living arrangement, using the observed 2006, 2011 and 2016 propensities

**Step 10:** Removing Negative Values from Projected propensities

**Step 11:** Projected propensities are adjusted to add to 100% of Victoria

**Step 12:** The projected propensities are multiplied by the projected population, to obtain projected total population by living arrangement type. Population projections were taken from the Population Projections conducted under this project 2016-2036.

**Step 13:** Deriving numbers of households by each living arrangement using Households to Population Ratios.

**Step 14:** Projected numbers of households by each living arrangements prorated to Total Victoria (produced at Step 4 above).

**Step 15:** Producing Projected Indigenous Persons for projection years by converting Projected ERPs to Persons in Indigenous Households using Persons to ERO Ratios.

## 3.2 Households Projection Outcomes Victoria

### 3.2.1 Households Number, Size and Growth Rates

In 2016 there were 22,756 Indigenous households in Victoria. Indigenous households in Victoria continue to grow during the 2016-2036 projection years with an average high rate of 4% per year and will reach 50,328 households in year 2036. During this period, the number of persons living in Indigenous households (that include non-Indigenous persons) will grow slightly slower at the rate of 3.8% per year. Family and household fragmentation are the main cause of faster growth of households. As a result, household size will see very marginal change.



## VII. EXPLANATORY NOTES



### 7.1 Who is an Indigenous person?

Since 1996, a standard Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander identification question has been used by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) in censuses. In the 1996 Census, for the first time, people were given the choice to identify themselves as being of both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander origin. The accompanying instruction to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander identification question was changed for the 1996 Census to allow people to mark both of the 'yes' boxes (ABS, 2016):

#### 7 Is the person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin?

- For persons of both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander origin, mark both 'Yes' boxes.

- No
- Yes, Aboriginal
- Yes, Torres Strait Islander

A definition of an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person was given in a High Court judgement in the case of *Commonwealth v. Tasmania* (1983) 46 ALR 625. This definition states that an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander is a person of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent who identifies as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and is accepted as such by the community in which he or she lives.

Although the census question relates to descent, some respondents will interpret the question to mean both descent and identification. The question also does not take into account the third part of the definition—community acceptance.

### 7.2 Fertility

Total Fertility Rate (TFR) is the total number of children a woman will bear during her entire reproductive life given the age-specific fertility rates remain constant.

Mortpack for windows 2003 procedure FERTPF is used to derive fertility estimates using

information on Children Ever Born (CEB) by Age of mother. The essential methodology was developed by G. Mortara (1949). The variation included here was proposed by Arriaga (1983); it has the advantage of providing estimates of fertility change over time. In the same 1983 article, Arriaga presented an extension of the P/F technique originally developed by Brass (Brass and others, 1968). The Arriaga extension, presented in FERTPF, allows the demographer to estimate fertility at two points in time under conditions of fertility change. Children ever born data and the pattern of age-specific fertility is

necessary from two enumerations when fertility has not been constant.

### 7.3 Sex Ratio

The total number of males divided by the total number of females and expressed in 100. A sex ratio over 100 is referred to as high sex ratio while a sex ratio below 100 is referred to as low sex ratio.

### 7.4 Trends

As numbers get smaller confidence in their accuracy is reduced and although no formal sampling has been carried out, it becomes more obvious that there is potential for error nonetheless. Statistical methods can be used to model trend data in various ways, incorporating appropriate assumptions about the nature of the trend in the past, present and future. Projecting rates into the future is a means of providing an estimate of the rate of future occurrence.

In this project, we have used average annual percent change to calculate a projected rate/

relativity. This is accomplished through linear extrapolation, by iteratively increasing or decreasing the number or rate according to the average annual percent change of the observed.

## **7.5 Population Growth**

Population growth rate is calculated using exponential formula [ $r=\ln(p_t/p_0)/t$ ] where r: growth rate, ln: natural logarithm,  $p_t$ : population at time t, and  $p_0$ : base population.

## **7.6 Projections**

Procedure PROJECT of the UN Mortpak V4 software has been used to produce projection outputs. The procedure projects annually a population by age and sex for up to 100 years, based on the initial population (by five-year age groups and sex) and an assumption of future changes in fertility, mortality and migration.

The methodology used is cohort-component (see Shryock and Siegel, 1973). The steps are (1) estimation of projected levels and age patterns of mortality, fertility and migration for each single-year projection period; (2) estimation of the male and female populations by single years of age from the data in five-year age groups given as input; (3) sequential application of these annual age-specific mortality and fertility rates and migration to the population to provide annual projected populations by age and sex and demographic indicators.

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
