Calling all artists and performers...



Putting a freeze on winter fires

Simple home fire safety tips to practice this winter...

As the temperatures start to drop, it's important to take steps to make sure your family and home are **protected from winter fire hazards.** Home heating, cooking, clutter, and items like candles all contribute to an increased risk of fire in the cooler seasons.

Remember to check your smoke alarms batteries yearly and if you hear a beeping, the battery may need replacing. Smoke alarms must be installed and working, if faulty or not working report immediately to Maintenance on 1800 248 842 (free call), and do not remove from the roof. Your sixmonthly inspections are also important for fire prevention, as the AHV team can assess fire risks and smoke alarms.

Never leave open flames unattended such as cigarettes, candles, incense, oil burners or items that can start fires like lighters or matches. If smoking inside your home, ensure you never smoke in bed and that lit cigarettes are always extinguished properly.

Consider investing in a fire extinguisher or fire blanket for high risk areas, like the kitchen, so if a fire does start, you can act quickly.

Every family needs to develop a home fire escape plan and practice it. Your plan should include a designated safe meeting point that all family members know in case of emergency. Remember, if your safety is at risk, ring 000 immediately.

Complete Your Winter Fire Safety Checklist **Power and Appliances** Heaters are off before leaving the house Power boards aren't overloaded Faulty appliances reported immediately Keep children away from power sources and practice fire safety Smoke Alarms Smoke alarm batteries changed this year Smoke alarm tested Faults or concerns reported to maintenance immediately Kitchen and Laundry Cooking or open flames never left unattended Tea towels and pot holders are away from the stove Grills, fans and cooking surfaces are free from grease and residue Lint drawer in dryer cleaned Living Areas Candles, incense and oil burners are away from flammables Matches and lighters are out of reach from children Clothing, curtains or toys are away from heaters Bedroom No smoking in bed Electric blankets and/or heaters off

before falling asleep
