NAIDOC Family Day at the Farm a huge success

Wurundieri man Thane welcomed crowds to Country Collingwood Children's Farm, smoke rising above, it was as if everyone could feel this year's NAIDOC Family Day at the Farm would be one to remember.

We had more than 2000 people through the gates and we handed out hundreds of show bags. The kids loved the activities – emu feather crafting, face painting, etching and boomerang art – and listened on to storytelling by Yarra Libraries. Uncle Herb Patten and Maylene Yinarr performed beautiful music, too.

Everyone bopped along to Indigenous Outreach Projects hip hop and traditional performance, with broadcasting the whole event.

The stalls were a hit. We served thousands of sausages, hundreds of burgers, and many, many serves of popcorn and fairy floss to delighted young ones.

While the kids kicked the footy and ran around with Keon Park Stars, the oldies had fun of their own by taking part in our huge raffle, giving away thousands of dollars worth of donated prizes.

Our renter artists had an opportunity to show and sell their works and up in the barn, the Elders were treated to massages, scones and weaving.

A pathway to home ownership: The Victorian Homebuyer Fund

Are you interested in owning your own home?

Since its launch in October 2021, the Victorian Homebuyer Fund (VHF) has been helping thousands of Victorians buy their own home.

Aboriginal Housing Victoria is working with the Victorian Government and VHF participating lenders (Bank Australia, Bendigo Bank, Commonwealth Bank and Indigenous Business Australia) to support eligible Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Victorians to apply to the VHF.

The shared equity model offered through the VHF can help you own your own home sooner.

Artwork by Matthew Atkinson Dylan, a Yuin man, says he couldn't have bought a home within the next 15 years without the Victorian Homebuyer Fund.

"One of the most satisfying things about moving into my own home was being able to make it my own space. One of the first things I did was put up wallpaper and make a nice balcony to hang out on," he says.




Eligible First Nations applicants need a minimum 3.5% deposit (plus acquisition costs) to get started. The VHF will then contribute up to 35% of the purchase price, in exchange for an equivalent share in the property. The Government's contribution decreases the size of the mortgage you will require to buy a home, as. well as the deposit you will need to save, meaning you can get into your own home sooner.

Get informed about The Voice

Later this year, the whole of Australia will be asked to cast their vote to decide whether to change the constitution to recognise the First Peoples of this land by establishing an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. The Voice would give advice to the Australian Parliament and the Government on issues that impact the lives of First Nations people.

AHV spoke to renter Georgia* about why they are taking part in the referendum.



What does it mean to you to be a part of the referendum? It's about having a voice, letting me have a say and speaking on behalf of the community because I am a community member. Engaging other community members to have say.

Do you feel excited there is an opportunity for Aboriginal voices to be heard?

Finally! Yes, we finally get a chance to be heard. So why not take the opportunity.

Do you recommend renters get informed before the vote?

Definitely, go out and have a look, the good and the bad of the outcome.

We are excited to announce that by the end of 2023, we will have a new Renter Portal and SMS service which will provide more options of how you can communicate with us.

The Renter Portal and SMS service will allow you to connect with us from your phone, tablet or computer. You will be able to access personal information such as rent statements, tenancy forms & documents online. You can make a payment, log a repair request and more.

Annual Rent Review Update

Don't forget to send in your Annual Rent Review (ARR) documents if you haven't already.

Your eligibility for subsidised rent will soon be assessed, and you will then be advised of your rent payable.

The new rents will take effect on 18 September 2023.
